Police And Community Team

The Police And Community Team (P.A.C.T.) is comprised of one lieutenant, one sergeant, one corporal and four officers who engage in crime prevention and problem-solving activities with the community. All members of our P.A.C.T. unit have gone through extensive training and are State Certified Crime Prevention Specialists.

This unit is funded by CCPD (crime control prevention district) and is supported by 1/8% of sales tax collected. Bond passed in 2012 and has continued every year.


